The Suncoast Workforce provides employment and training services for Florida Workforce Region 18, comprised of Sarasota and Manatee Counties. Suncoast Workforce programs provide services under the Workforce Investment Act (WIA), Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF), and other federal, state and private grants, and make referrals to qualified Training Vendors for occupational training in demand occupations.

The Suncoast Workforce is now accepting Training Vendor Applications for Program Year 2011-2012 (July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2012). This application process will identify qualified training institutions to provide occupational training in skill areas of sustained labor market demand or growth. To be considered for inclusion on our Approved Training Vendor and Program list for 2011-2012, vendors must submit complete applications no later than 5 p.m., June 10, 2011. Applications submitted after that date may not be considered. All applications must be approved by the Board of Directors for approval.

To answer any questions Training Vendors may have regarding the application process, attendance at one the following **Information Session** is strongly encouraged. Sessions will be held on **May 17, 2011** from 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. and also on **May 19, 2011** from 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Both sessions will be held at the Suncoast Workforce office, 3660 N. Final contracting is contingent upon Workforce Florida's final approval of Regional Targeted Occupations, and upon local Board approval of Training Vendor applications.

SUNCOAST WORKFORCE TRAINING VENDOR CRITERIA

In order for a Training Vendor to be eligible for inclusion on Workforce Region 18, minimum criteria requires that Training Vendors:

- Must be either (1) a licensed public, post-secondary educational institution eligible to receive funds under Title IV of Higher Education Act, or (2) a private educational institution accredited and fully licensed by the Florida Department of Education, Commission for Independent Education, or (3) Training Vendor has a registered apprenticeship program under the National Apprenticeship Act.
- Must be in business in the State of Florida for at least two years;
- Must have current license and license must be for regional campus where Suncoast Workforce customers would attend;
- Must propose only programs that are (1) on the regional targeted occupations list, (2) fully accredited, and (3) allow the issuance of credentials upon training completion (certificate, degree, diploma);
- If located out of region, must demonstrate need for capacity outside of region;
- Must be able to demonstrate fiscal solvency; and,
- Must submit Training Vendor Application which is complete and accurate with all required attachments
- Must allow site visit prior to final approval and meet ADA requirements.

For Continued Eligibility, Training Vendors must:

- Maintain licensure through the Commission for Independent Education;
- Fulfill requirements as agreed to in your contract with Suncoast Workforce;
- Continue to supply student-based information to FETPIP;
- Update Training Vendor Application and Contract annually.
